Call for Award Nominations

Children's Law Center of Minnesota (CLC) is accepting nominations for the 2018 Heroes for Children Award and the 2018 Rosalie E. Wahl Justice for Children Award to be presented on October 11th at our Celebration of Champions annual benefit event.

Heroes for Children

This award recognizes an individual who has made significant contributions to the well-being of Minnesota's children in either a career or volunteer position. Nominees may work with children in any area—such as teaching, health care, legislation, advocacy, or mentoring—affecting physical, spiritual, social, or emotional well-being.

Last year's honoree was McKenna Ahrenholz, the brave 12-year-old who spoke up on behalf of Minnesota's children and insisted lawmakers to do better for the wellbeing of children in the foster care system.

Rosalie E. Wahl Justice for Children Award

This award is presented annually to someone who has dedicated their life to fighting for justice for at-risk or underprivileged children in our communities. This award is named for Justice Wahl for her tireless work on behalf of children. CLC created the Justice for Children Award in her name and honored Justice Wahl as the first recipient in 2005.

Last year's honoree was the late Ann Marie Hanrahan, a dedicated, talented attorney who committed her time and passion to work diligently on behalf of her CLC clients in and out of the courtroom. Her legacy will have an impact for many years to come.
